Notes 1- Ranun on Port D., and Kanun was
Dunquies Harbor sheets. I think the former a
typographical error. Wilkes seems to have
adopted many of the words of the Indian
Jargon, as names of places, and this may be
one Ca-mini, canoe. Or it may be the
patronymic (Kanun) adopted by a formerly
influential family among the Indians
of this vicinity.

2- From its geological character - the
Indians call it Stone-nose

3- From the fact of a shipmaster and a
sailor having been murdered there
by Indians several years ago.

4- Callam is the true orthography - it is
named after the Indian tribe inhabiting
this locality. The same remark applies
to this Bay in the Straits of Juan de Fuca
- it is usually spelt on the maps Callam.

5- Wilkes has two other points so named
in this section - the repetition tends to
create confusion.
